



Butalbital is a barbiturate often combined with acetaminophen, caffeine, or codeine, used primarily to treat tension headaches and muscle contraction headaches. In 2025, regulatory changes have tightened control over butalbital products due to abuse and diversion concerns.

Butalbital-containing medications are now treated as Schedule III controlled substances in many states, requiring strict prescription controls including:

- A valid prescription from a licensed healthcare provider following diagnosis of tension or muscle contraction headaches.
- Prior authorization may be required, with limitations on quantity (e.g., maximum 144 tablets per 90 days for some formulations).
- Patients must be 12 years or older (varies with product), with careful liver function evaluation due to acetaminophen content.
- Prescribers must counsel patients on risks, including acetaminophen use limits, risk of abuse, and no concurrent opioid addiction therapy.
- Prescriptions and dispensing require DEA registration for pharmacies and compliance with inventory and monitoring programs.
- Treatment duration is usually limited to 6 months, with close monitoring for abuse and misuse.

Online purchase for immediate dispatch is legal only if accompanied by a compliant prescription meeting these regulatory requirements, dispensed by licensed pharmacies adhering to federal and state guidelines.
