

Butalbital is a barbiturate commonly combined with other substances like acetaminophen, caffeine, aspirin, or codeine and is used primarily for tension or muscle contraction headaches. Due to its sedative properties and potential for abuse, butalbital-containing products are regulated and require a prescription.

As of 2025, butalbital prescription regulations include prior-approval policies emphasizing the need for clinical appropriateness. Patients must generally be aged 12 years or older (18 for codeine-containing products), with no existing liver function concerns or cirrhosis. Prescribers must counsel patients regarding concurrent use of acetaminophen-containing products, evaluate for misuse risk, and participate in opioid analgesic Risk Evaluation and Mitigation Strategy (REMS) programs.

Quantity limits often apply, such as a maximum daily opioid dose capped at 200 morphine milligram equivalents (MME) with and 90 MME without prior authorization. Prescription durations typically extend to up to 6 months with renewal policies in place. Codeine-containing butalbital products have additional opioid-specific restrictions.

It is essential only to obtain butalbital from licensed healthcare providers and verified pharmacies adhering to these regulations. Unverified online sources may pose risks such as counterfeit medications and unsafe use.
