

Gabapentin is classified as a Schedule V controlled substance in some regions as of 2025, with specific prescribing and dispensing requirements to enhance safety and control misuse. Montana, for example, includes gabapentin as a Schedule V substance with strict prescription writing, security, and reporting to prescription drug monitoring programs (PDMPs) effective October 2025.

Key prescribing requirements include:

- Prescription must be written by a DEA-registered provider including full information (patient, prescriber, DEA number).
- Prescriptions expire in 6 months with up to 5 refills.
- Electronic prescriptions must comply with DEA electronic prescribing standards.
- Positive patient identification is required at pickup.
- Prior authorization may be necessary depending on clinical indications (e.g., neuropathic pain, post-herpetic neuralgia, restless leg syndrome).
- The drug has quantity limits, typically capped at 3600 mg per day.
- Usage in pediatric populations is limited and regulatory compliance is essential.

In other regions, such as North Carolina, gabapentin is not a controlled substance but is reported in controlled substance reporting systems to monitor usage and prevent abuse.

In summary, buying gabapentin online for immediate dispatch in 2025 requires a valid prescription from a licensed healthcare provider adhering to region-specific regulations including DEA registration, prescription monitoring, and quantity controls, dispensed by authorized pharmacies ensuring patient safety and drug authenticity.
