

Gabapentin, used for neuropathic pain and seizures, is increasingly regulated as a controlled substance due to abuse potential. As of October 1, 2025, in Montana and some other jurisdictions, gabapentin is classified as a Schedule V controlled substance, requiring prescriptions to comply with DEA writing and dispensing regulations, including security, recordkeeping, identity verification, and reporting to prescription drug monitoring programs.

Prescriptions must include the prescriber's DEA number, patient information, and have an expiration of 6 months with up to 5 refills. Electronic prescriptions must comply with DEA electronic prescribing standards. In some locations such as the UK, gabapentin is also controlled, limited to 30-day supplies, and prescriptions must follow additional safety rules.

Gabapentin prescriptions typically require a medical diagnosis, evaluation of patient risk factors, and monitoring to avoid misuse or serious side effects. Prescriptions cannot be issued by certain prescriber types without a drug license, and pharmacies must comply with strict dispensing policies.
