



Opana ER, which contains extended-release oxymorphone, is a Schedule II controlled opioid medication used for managing moderate to severe chronic pain requiring continuous, around-the-clock opioid treatment. However, due to serious safety concerns related to abuse, including outbreaks of HIV, hepatitis C, and thrombotic microangiopathy linked to intravenous misuse, the FDA requested the removal of Opana ER from the U.S. market, with shipments ending September 1, 2017. New prescriptions for both branded and generic Opana ER are no longer approved or legal in the U.S.

Because of this removal, Opana ER cannot be legally purchased with a prescription online or through any pharmacy in the U.S. Patients on Opana ER have been advised to transition to alternative opioid medications or other treatments in consultation with their healthcare providers.

In summary, it is not legally possible to buy Opana ER online with secure delivery anymore. Patients needing opioid treatment should consult their medical providers for legal and safer alternatives given Opana ER's market withdrawal and associated risks
