

Oxymorphone is a potent Schedule II opioid analgesic used for managing severe pain that requires opioid treatment when other pain medications are inadequate or not tolerated. It is available as immediate-release (IR) tablets and extended-release (ER) tablets under brand names such as Opana, although Opana ER was withdrawn from the market in 2017 due to public health concerns related to abuse and associated outbreaks.
