- **Oxycodone** – opioid analgesic
- **Acetaminophen (Paracetamol)** – non-opioid pain reliever & fever reducer

This dual action helps provide **strong relief for severe pain**, such as:

- Severe injury trauma
- Pain after dental surgery
- Short-term orthopedic pain

Percocet is **not recommended** for mild pain or long-term chronic pain unless specifically prescribed.

Available Percocet Strengths

Common tablet strengths include:

2.5 mg	325 mg	Percocet 2.5/325
5 mg	325 mg	Percocet 5/325
7.5 mg	325 mg	Percocet 7.5/325
10 mg	325 mg	Percocet 10/325

Final dose depends on **individual medical condition, pain severity, age, & tolerance level.**

Proper Medical Use

Doctors prescribe Percocet when:

- Non-opioid pain meds don't work
- Pain intensity is severe or acute
- Controlled & supervised short-term treatment is required

Percocet should be taken **exactly as prescribed**. Do not:

- Take more tablets than instructed

- Take doses closer together than prescribed
- Share medication
- Mix with alcohol or sedatives



How Percocet Works

Percocet works in two ways:

Ingredient	Function
Oxycodone	Alters pain perception in the brain & spinal cord
Acetaminophen	Enhances pain-relief effect, reduces fever

Peak pain-relief normally occurs within **30–60 minutes**.



Side Effects of Percocet

Common Side Effects

- Sleepiness or dizziness
- Constipation
- Nausea or vomiting
- Lightheadedness
- Sweating
- Itching

Serious Side Effects (Seek urgent care)

- Trouble breathing or slow breathing
- Confusion, hallucinations
- Severe drowsiness or inability to stay awake
- Blue lips or fingertips (lack of oxygen)

- Signs of liver damage (yellow eyes/skin)

Risks & Warnings

Percocet carries significant risks:

♦ **Addiction & Dependence**

Opioids may cause physical dependence & addiction, even with proper use.

♦ **Respiratory Depression**

High doses can dangerously slow breathing.

♦ **Liver Damage**

Due to acetaminophen — do not exceed recommended daily limits.

♦ **Drug Interactions**

Avoid combining with:

- Alcohol
- Sleeping pills
- Benzodiazepines (e.g., Xanax, Valium)
- Other opioids
- “Cold & flu” meds containing acetaminophen

Who Should Not Take Percocet?

Avoid unless approved by a doctor if you have:

- Severe respiratory disorders
- Liver disease
- Head injuries
- Drug/alcohol addiction history

- Asthma or breathing problems

Pregnant or breastfeeding individuals should consult a physician.

Avoid Counterfeit or Illegal Purchases

Unregulated online pharmacies may sell pills that contain:

- **Fentanyl**
- **Heroin**
- **Unknown filler chemicals**
- **Dangerously high opioid concentrations**

These can lead to **overdose and death**.

Always purchase from **licensed pharmacies** with a prescription.

Safe Storage and Disposal

- Store in a secure place away from others
- Never leave within reach of children
- Dispose at authorized medication take-back centers

Is Percocet available without a prescription?

No. Percocet legally requires a **doctor's prescription**.
